Developmental Disabilities Waiver

Population Served

Applicants must be:

- Age 3 or older,
- Meet the level of care for Intermediate Care Facilities for the Developmentally Disabled (ICF/DD), and
- Be clients of the Developmental Disabilities Program at the Agency for Persons with Disabilities.

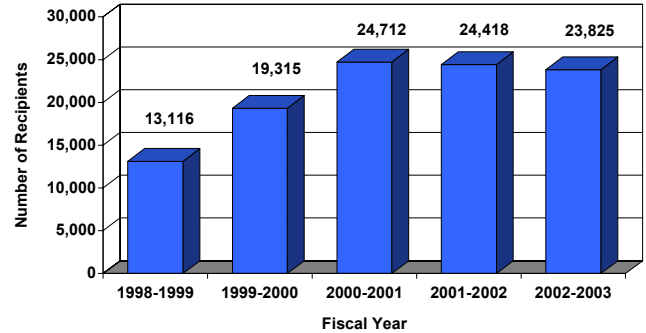
Eligibility

Participants in the Developmental Disabilities (DD) Waiver must meet the level of care criteria for placement in an ICF/DD, with an intelligence quotient (IQ) of 59 or less; or have an IQ of 60-69 with a secondary handicapping condition of cerebral palsy, spina bifida, Prader-Willi syndrome, epilepsy, or autism. Persons with an IQ of 60-69 with a primary disability of autism, cerebral palsy, spina bifida, or Prader-Willi syndrome are also eligible for DD Waiver services when the disability results in substantial functional limitations in the areas of self-care, learning, mobility, self-direction, understanding and use of language, and capacity for being able to live independently.

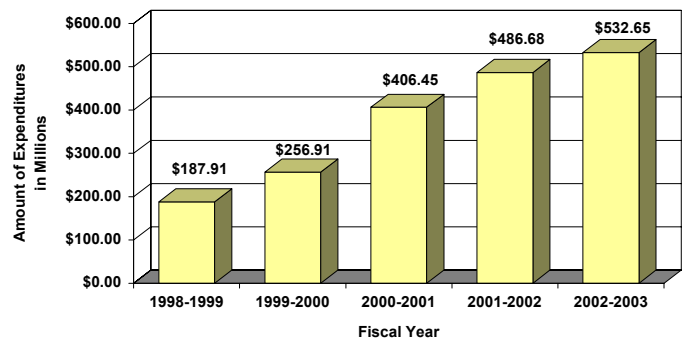
Services Provided

Adult day training, adult dental, behavior analysis and assistant services, chore, companion, consumable medical supplies, dietitian, durable medical equipment/supplies, environmental accessibility adaptations, homemaker, in-home supports, medication review, non-residential support, personal care assistance, personal emergency response systems, physical, occupational, respiratory and speech therapies, private duty, residential and skilled nursing, psychological assessment, residential habilitation, respite care, special medical home care, specialized mental health, support coordination, supported employment, supported living coaching, therapeutic massage and assessment, and transportation.

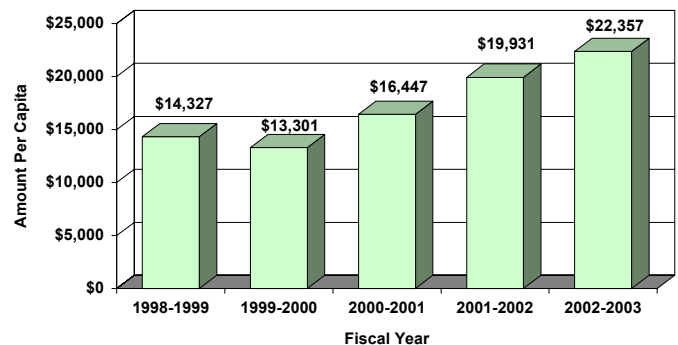
Total Unduplicated Waiver Recipient Count

Supported Living Waiver

Population Served

Applicants must be

- Age 18 or older,
- Meet the level of care for Intermediate Care Facilities for the Developmentally Disabled (ICF/DD),
- Be clients of the Developmental Disabilities Program at the Agency for Persons with Disabilities,
- Legally competent or supported by their legal guardian in their decision to move to a supported living situation,
- Be able to direct their own supports in all but limited areas, and
- Be able to identify and participate in the planning and implementation of support necessary to manage their household, and participate in community life.

Eligibility

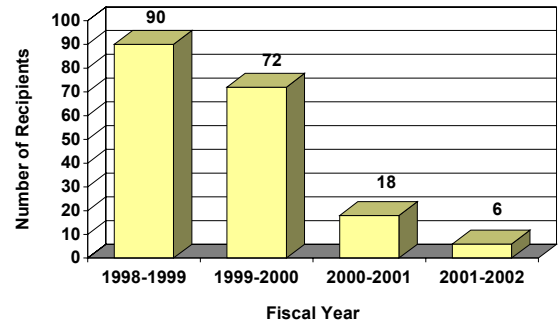
Participants in the Supported Living (SL) waiver must meet the level of care criteria for placement in an ICF/DD, with an intelligence quotient (IQ) of 59 or less; or have an IQ of 60-69 with a secondary handicapping condition of cerebral palsy, spina bifida, Prader-Willi syndrome, epilepsy, autism. Persons with an IQ of 60-69 with a primary disability of autism, cerebral palsy, spina bifida, or Prader-Willi syndrome are also eligible for SL Waiver services when the disability results in substantial functional limitations in the areas of self-care, learning, mobility, self-direction, understanding and use of language, and capacity for being able to live independently.

Services Provided

Adult day training, in-home supports, supported employment, supported living coaching, and transportation.

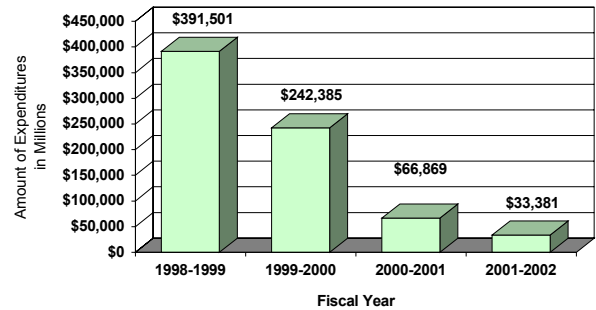
The Supported Living Waiver serves persons who are more independent and need only the limited service menu offered by the waiver.

Total Unduplicated Waiver Recipient Count

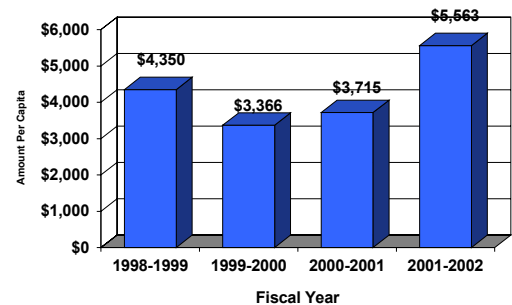


From 1999 through 2002, Supported Living Waiver participants were transferred to the DD waiver. The 2003-04 Legislature authorized a \$28 million appropriation to expand this waiver to serve up to 2,000 consumers and expand the service menu by five new services.

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Intermediate Care Facility Services for the Developmentally Disabled (ICF-DD)

Eligibility

To receive Medicaid Intermediate Care Facility Services for the Developmentally Disabled (ICF-DD), the recipient must be determined to be financially eligible for the Institutional Care Program (ICP) by the local Department of Children and Families Economic Self-Sufficiency program. Eligibility for ICP is determined using service-specific financial eligibility criteria. Medicaid's income trust policy allows institutionalized individuals with income over the Medicaid program standards to qualify for Medicaid. If an individual establishes a qualified income trust within federal requirements and meets all other financial eligibility criteria, the individual qualifies for Medicaid ICP coverage.

To satisfy the medical criteria for services, participants must satisfy ICF/DD level of need standards and one of the following disability conditions:

1. The recipient's primary disability is mental retardation with an intelligence quotient (IQ) of 59 or less.
2. The recipient's primary disability is mental retardation with an intelligence quotient (IQ) of 60-69 inclusive; and the recipient has at least one of the following handicapping conditions: ambulation deficits, sensory deficits, chronic health problems, behavior problems, autism, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, spina bifida, or Prader-Willi syndrome.
3. The recipient's primary disability is mental retardation with an intelligence quotient (IQ) of 60-69 inclusive; and the recipient has severe functional limitations in at least three of the following major life activities: self-care, understanding and use of language, learning, mobility, self-direction, or capacity for independent living.

4. The recipient is eligible under the category of autism, cerebral palsy, spina bifida, or Prader-Willi syndrome; and the recipient has severe functional limitations in at least three of the following major life activities: self-care, understanding and use of language, learning, mobility, self-direction, or capacity for independent living.

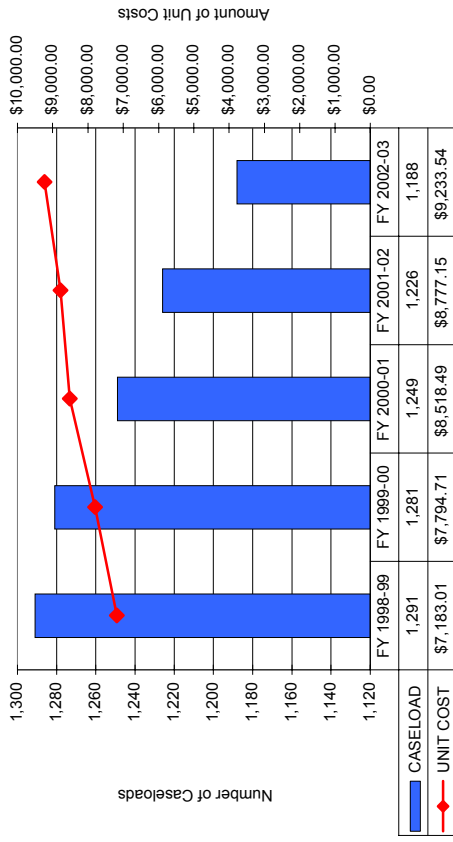
The determination of medical necessity for ICF/DD services is based on the outcome of a uniform assessment of need. The Developmental Disabilities program uses the APD approved assessment tool to determine level of need (LON).

Services Covered by Per Diem

Room; private room, when determined medically necessary by the recipient's physician; a five-day supply of clothing; behavior services; dental services; preventative health care; nutritional services; personal care services; medication services; psychotropic medication services; habilitative and restorative care services; therapy services; assistance with activities of daily living; recreational and leisure services; incontinence supplies; medical equipment; adaptive equipment; stock medical supplies; podiatry services, when referred by the recipient's attending physician and determined medically necessary; and transportation.

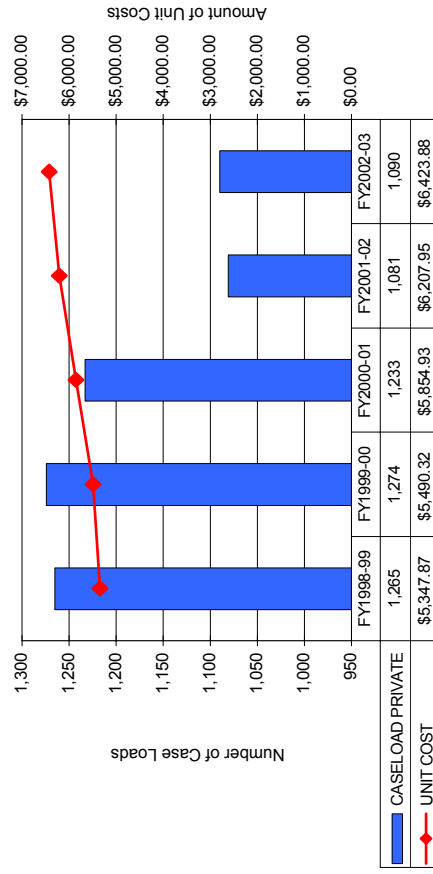

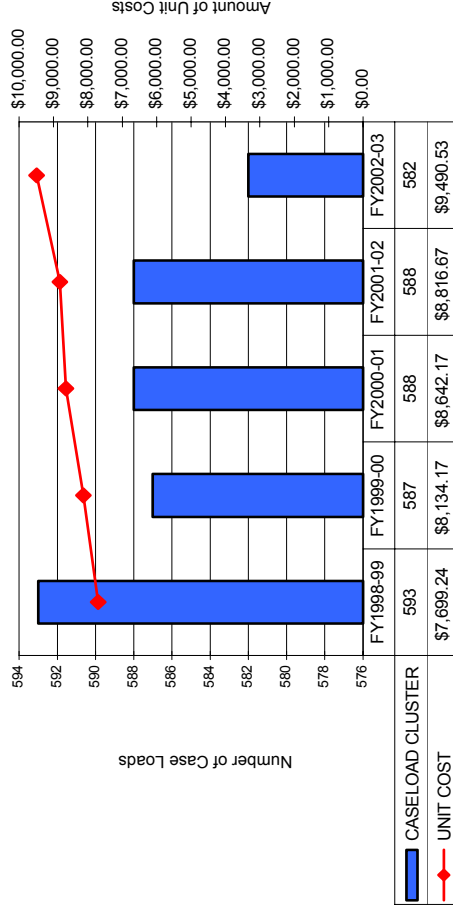

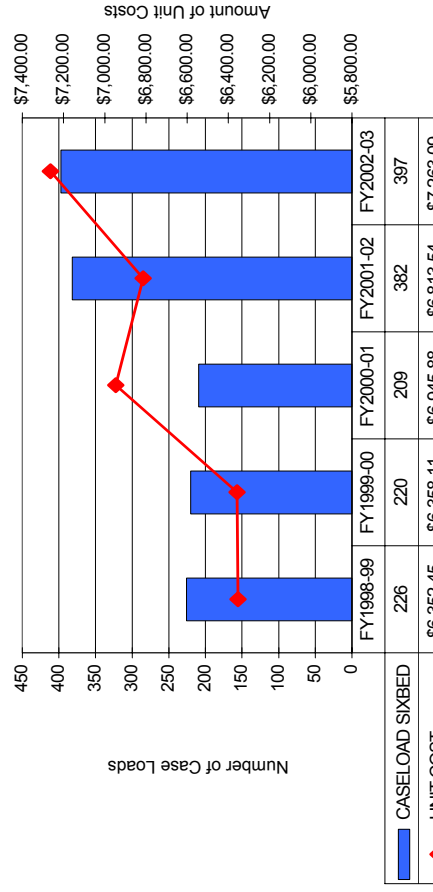
